On Job Dec 02 2019 Even prior to his death on 15 November 1280, the Dominican master Albert of Lauingen was legendary on account of his erudition. Albert completed *Super Iob* in 1272 or 1274, when he was over seventy years old, at the Dominican Kloster of Heilige Kreuz in Cologne, where, as lector emeritus of the Order, he likely lectured on this profound biblical book. Significantly, Albert may

have been inspired to produce *On Job* by his most famous student, Thomas Aquinas, who had written his own *Joban* commentary, the *Expositio super Iob ad litteram*, while serving as conventual lector at San Domenico in Orvieto from 1261 to 1264. Yet Albert occupies a unique position in the history of the interpretation of *Job*: he is the first and only exegete in history who explicitly reads the whole book as a debate in the mode of an academic or scholastic disputation among *Job* and his friends about divine providence concerning human affairs. The Introduction to this volume situates Albert's *On Job*--its general approach and key exegetical features--in the broad context of Dominican theological education and pastoral formation in the thirteenth century.
