Requirements are precise statements that reflect the needs of customers and users of an intended computer system, e.g. a word processor must include a spell-checker, security access is to be given to authorized personnel only, updates to customer information must be made every 10 seconds. Requirements engineering is being recognized as increasingly important - no other aspect of software engineering has enjoyed as much growth in recent years. More

and more organizations are either improving their requirements engineering process or thinking about doing so.

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
