Cathy, with her handy toolbox and advanced knowledge of robotics and IT, is ignored while the adults bungle the process of assembling baby Flange, with near catastrophic results. Robobaby is a shout-out for girl scientists and makers, and a treat for all young robot enthusiasts.
