[Tourism and Language in Vieques](#) Dec 09 2020 After more than sixty years of occupation by the U.S. Navy and intensive community struggles, the Puerto Rican island of Vieques was finally returned to civilian control in 2003. But, as this book documents, the Viequenses' struggles were far from over after the departure of the Navy.
