In an open economy model that incorporates key structural characteristics of agricultural commodity exporters including dual labor markets, the benefits of exchange rate flexibility are shown to depend on the extent of labor and product market development. With developed markets, flexible exchange rates are preferred as

they allow for greater relative price fluctuations, which amplify the transmission mechanism of labor reallocation upon commodity price volatility.
