Surprisingly, my first weighing tests, which were conducted in 1984 using a manually operated balance, a small geometrically shaped detector, and a folded reference system, yielded significant gravitational anomalies. The mass of the detector appeared to change over time. If this change proved to be real, it would demonstrate a violation of the law of conservation of mass, one of the fundamental concepts of modern physics. After more than 35 years of further research, the hypothesis was finally confirmed that the apparent violation of the law of conservation of mass was due to a previously unknown form of matter displaying both macroscopic mass and a field-like structure. It turned out that this invisible matter could be absorbed by special detectors that contain newly generated phase boundaries..."**
